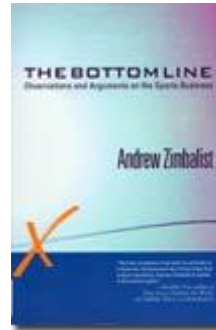


The athletic crusade : sport and American cultural imperialism

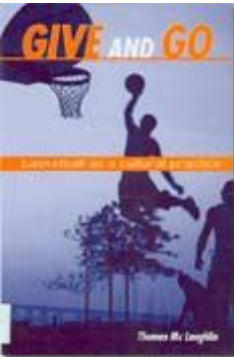

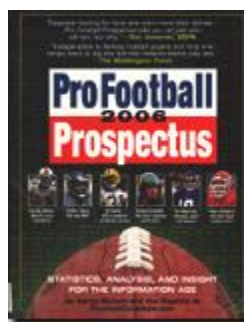
